Reading: from 1 Samuel 16:1-14

The Lord said to Samuel, "Fill your animal horn with olive oil and go on your way. I am sending you to Jesse in Bethlehem. I have chosen one of his sons to be king."

Samuel did what the Lord said. He arrived at Bethlehem. The elders of the town met him. They asked, "Have you come in peace?"

Then the Lord said, "Get up and anoint him. This is the one."


Thought about the reading
